What do the William Trent House, Stony Brook Elementary School, and the Conference Center at Mercer Community College have in common? All three bear the distinction of being associated with local Trenton-based firm Fraytak Veisz Hopkins Duthie, PC, now in its 95th year of business. Founded as Micklewright and

Mountford in 1918, FVHD has provided architecture, planning, interior design, and roof consulting services to academic, municipal, and commercial clients in Mercer County and beyond the New Jersey state border, helping to shape countless communities. Over the years, the firm gained a reputation for excellence in design and won state acclaim for the historical restoration design of the William Trent House, built in 1719, Trinity Cathedral, and three elementary schools in Trenton. In the

1990s, the firm worked on a joint venture for the design of Waterfront Park Stadium and the Mercer County Civil Courthouse. Today, FVHD is an award-winning architectural firm that employs 28 professionals with offices in New Jersey and Pennsylvania.
